Twenty-two years ago, Ralf Weber and Peter Brown, while fishing out of Seabeam, discovered business opportunities in Bamfield: Peter, Kingfisher and Ralf, T & T. When Ralf told Rita about T & T, she replied, "Are you crazy?" They ran the café and leased the store to the Mathers. This didn't work out and the Mathers moved

across the street and set up Kamshee Store. Ralf had to adjust to working with women (he had run a construction company for 40 years, dealing with rough labourers). Often they felt they were a school for Huu-ay-aht youths: "We'd just get someone trained and off they'd go to work elsewhere." Ralf and Rita stayed close to home. Rita's only west side excursion was a visit to the Red Cross Outpost. "I never walked on Bradys Beach," said Rita, whose fondest Bamfield memories were watching Bamfield kids grow up. Ralf, who was active in the Chamber of Commerce for 10 years, noted, "I've never met Pat [Byres]. Never felt we were in competition...seeing Bamfielders in Costco seemed strange." Rita, T & T baker extraordinaire, learned her craft in nursing school in Germany. They were quiet contributors, giving where they saw need. Their promotion of The New Bamfielder has raised significant funds for our youth programs. They are fond of Bamfield and thank their customers. They do worry. Number Please. The continuing saga of Bamfield telecommunications by **Suzanne Jennings**. "In our 'old' house, along the path from Ostrom's shop, the kitchen was a long narrow room that opened from an outside porch. Behind the kitchen door was the telephone located high up on the wall. It was a long rectangular brown wooden box that had a black speaker sticking out of the centre and a hook and black ear receiver that hung on a metal holder on the side. There must have been a crank handle on the other side. I can't remember that part. I do remember that I had to drag a chair over from the table and climb up on it to be tall enough to speak into the speaker. Calls didn't come very frequently. Apparently I answered a long distance call from Port Alberni once that luckily happened to be my mum.

"When you traveled by boat to Port Alberni, Grappler Creek or along the trail from the Cable Station to Pachena lighthouse or from the Lifeboat Station to Cape Beale you saw (can still see) the poles strung with telephone wire and insulators. That was the, new for the time, revolutionary system of communication maintained by linemen. Bamfield had a series of linemen who lived in the village and worked in the canal and walked along the lighthouse trails maintaining and repairing the telephone lines. The lineman's cabin at Connor Creek at the end of Pachena beach was one of several the men could use when out repairing a downed line along the west coast trail." **To be continued!!!**
